Dear Parents and Carers,

Year 6 Transition Week

I am sorry to have to inform you that due to the current Covid-19 restrictions we are unable to hold our Year 6 into Year 7 Transition Week for all schools as planned, which was due to take place the week beginning 5th July. As I am sure you are aware, the current Covid-19 regulations and restrictions have been extended until the 19th July. This has meant that we are unable to host groups of students from multiple schools on the same day due to the need to keep pupils in school bubbles.

Instead we have been forced to revise our plans for our transition week. Due to the restrictions we are therefore now only able to host some of our main feeder schools for one day each.

We appreciate that this will be very disappointing for many of you, as it is for us, however as a compromise we wanted to offer an experience for some, rather than no transition for anyone. The reason for our decision regarding these schools is that they are our largest feeder schools and can therefore for practical reasons stay in a school bubble for the day.

Although this news will be of disappointment, you will have already been informed about the Summer School we are running, during the month of August which is free to all participants. I would encourage you to sign your son or daughter up for this experience as this will form a significant part of our transition process, giving the pupils the opportunity to make new friendships and experience time in this new environment.
